### ANNE FLORA

### "A Fiber Artist's Journey"

Anne Flora is a lifelong artist who has studied modern dance, choreography, and costuming in addition to her extensive educational background in the fine arts. She moved to New York City for a further study printmaking and worked as an independent printmaker while she pursued a degree in culinary arts. Abandoning printmaking after 16 years because the medium no longer appealed to her, Anne moved to Wales where she operated a Bed and Breakfast for several years and would not be involved with any artform for 10 years.

Moving to Michigan and beginning a challenging new career, Anne began to feel the need to create after the long hiatus. In 2000, she began to explore felt making and by 2001, after taking a workshop with Chad Alice Hagen, she fell in love with the medium. Fascinated with the crossover in mediums, her experimentation with a myriad of fibers and other materials continues. Anne's process emphasizes discipline, emotions, the vitality and movement in her compositions, the richness of textures, and the bold and vibrant colors that she uses, and er work embodies her rich life experiences along with her lifelong studies in the visual and tactile arts.

# Workshop

### "Nuno Felted Wall Hanging"

Starting with a base of white pre-felted Merino wool, particupants will create a design by layering various materials that could include Merino fiber, wool yarn, thinner fabrics, and pre-felt scraps, etc. The piece is then saturated with a warm soap solution, massaged to form an artful Nuno hanging, rinsed in cold water, and then blocked to shape.

The first day of the workshop, we will be designing and wet felting the hanging. The participants will rinse the piece and take it home to block it. The second day of the workshop will be devoted to embellishing the hangings and a discussion of how to display the finished work.

Participants should search their stash(es) for design elements that complement their felted piece, such as embroidery cotton, ribbon, yarn, beads, pieces of old jewelry, found objects, etc.

All of the squares, and their stories, will be in a 50th photo review to come out later.








# Vintage Show & Tell




Shown: Judy Loyd's early Granny Square quilt. "I made loads for all my friends, with the request to not leave large "holes" that toes could get stuck in."



### JESSICA GRADY

### "Journey into the Unconventional"

Jessica is a contemporary embroidery artist who works from her home studio just outside of Leeds, West Yorkshire. Her colourful and contemporary work has been exhibited in various galleries across the UK and Europe and she is a member of the Crafts Council's Makers directory and renowned textiles group – Art Textiles Made in Britain. She was awarded the Embroiderers' Guild Scholar in 2018/19. Jessica also speaks about her creative practice and teaches workshops across the country in schools, universities and for private organisations.

Her sculptural designs are a textural and visual feast, combining bold colour and clusters of embellished treasure that is created from a combination of waste and recycled materials. Jessica uses various processes including printing, foiling, dyeing and melting to transform what others perceive to be rubbish into tactile and creative embellishments. All of her designs are hand stitched; Jessica uses traditional stitches in contemporary colours and patterns, flecking fabrics with bold neon lines and metallic loops.

Colour is an important aspect of her work – her designs are fearless in their use of strong colours, creating a very vivid and saturated colour palette. Jessica's inspiration is derived from zoomed in views of surface texture details such as peeling paint, barnacles and rusting metal. Her sculptural, framed and 3-D textiles provide a statement in any interior space.

Michelle has received numerous awards for her artwork and has participated in group and solo shows throughout the Midwest and is collected by nature enthusiasts worldwide.
