Our NTGM September Workshop has spaces available for members and non-members!

This is a great-looking and practical crossbody bag that you won't want to miss making. Consider inviting a friend to join you.



On Tuesday afternoon: Fabric and interfacing are cut out. The pattern pieces are all rectangular and easy to cut with a cutting mat, ruler, and rotary cutter. Debi will discuss outer fabric, lining, interfacing and go over the special features with bag construction: front zippered pocket, top zipper, back slip pocket interior, slip pocket, adjustable strap, short handles, and reinforced base. Students may wish to start sewing on their tote during the week.

On the following Monday: Debi will assess students' progress and will assist with zipper, pocket, strap, and hardware installations.



"Working in a Series: Developing Your Artistic Voice"

Jennifer Gould is a textile artist and doll maker, whose artistic endeavors also include tapestries, fabric painted jackets, free-form crochet, and crazy quilt embroidery work. She has worked in series for years on many different themes and mediums within textiles and now has a large volume and variety of work to explain and illustrate her artist's voice.

When you begin to work in textiles or any medium, you try all different techniques and styles. Gradually, the longer you practice, you realize that staying within one technique or theme until you have tried every conceivable way to express yourself within that area, gives you the chance to develop your work. When jurying for shows, especially solo shows, jurors look for that thematic series that tells them who you are as an artist.

Jennifer will discuss the elements of developing your artist's voice in her presentation.

"Contemporary Embroidery: Exploring Beyond the Basics"

Most textile enthusiasts know the basic stitches of embroidery, such as running stitch, straight stitch, blanket stitch and more. In developing her style and artistic voice in embroidery, Jennifer has worked to expand the ways in which she uses the basic stitches to express more directly - and differently - what she wants her textile work to convey.

With many pages of handouts to illustrate the stitches and more, such as rhythm studies, participants will use their own hand-dyed, printed/painted, or interesting commercial printed/random dyed fabric on which to experiment. Jennifer will have many pieces of her own work on display to demonstrate these unique stitch explorations. Combining collage and using sheers and textured fabrics with these explorations can achieve an exciting level of creativity.



This workshop is not just for quilters. If you are interested in surface design, this is the workshop for you! Advanced techniques using fusing, non-woven products, paint, stencils, Inktense blocks, and cutting machines will be covered. Quilting and facing will also be demonstrated and discussed.

Although a very extensive PDF supply list will be provided prior to class, you do not need to purchase everything. You can attend the first session with what you already own and use the time between sessions to get other supplies that interest you.

Rachel is generously leaving her recordings up for one year, so you will have plenty of time to try out various techniques.

Optional Session (in-person without a speaker). Location: TBD.

This will be an opportunity to get together and share materials and tools, such as paints, pencils, Inktense blocks, etc., and have the use of electronic cutters (such as Cricut and Scan N Cut). Access to Rachel's pre-recorded videos demonstrating various techniques will be available. There will be a kit fee (TBD) for this session.




CORINNE PHILLIPS "On Being a Fairytale Maker..."

JESSICA GRADY

"Journey into the Unconventional"

Jessica is a contemporary embroidery artist who works from her home studio just outside of Leeds, West Yorkshire. Her colourful and contemporary work has been exhibited in various galleries across the UK and Europe. A member of the Crafts Council's Makers directory, Jessica speaks about her creative practice and teaches workshops across the country in schools, universities, and for private organisations.

Her sculptural designs are a textural and visual feast, combining bold colour and clusters of embellished treasure that is created from a combination of waste and recycled materials. Jessica uses various processes including printing, foiling, dyeing and melting to transform what others perceive to be rubbish into tactile and creative embellishments. Her designs are hand stitched using traditional stitches in contemporary colours and patterns.

Colour is an important aspect of her work – her designs are fearless in their use of strong colours, creating a very vivid and saturated colour palette. Jessica's inspiration is derived from zoomed in views of surface texture details such as peeling paint, barnacles, and rusting metal.

Workshop (one workshop – two sessions)

"Make Your Own Sequins"

Fuse various recycled plastics to make sequin sheets, which will then be cut out in different ways, adding textile foils, and stitching onto fabric to make a sampler.

"Fantasy Florals"

Create beautiful 3D floral designs on fabric, using a range of mixed media materials combined with hand embroidery. Jessica will show you some of her techniques to create the most beautiful blooms including 3D folded petals, beaded stamens, and curling leaves and vines. Discussion will focus on the use of traditional textile materials, and ways to include recycled and waste materials, transforming them into embellished treasure. Participants will make a mini textile sampler of floral ideas, ready to frame as a piece of textile art. Finishing and framing ideas will also be discussed.



"Introduction to Watercolor: A modern approach to the medium using paper and fiber"

In this workshop participants will learn the basics of the watercolor medium including watercolor tools, techniques and principles. Participants will learn the basics while creating nature inspired paintings of flowers and birds. We will also practice using watercolor to dye fabric swatches perfect for slow stitching and practicing using a needle and thread directly on watercolor paper.
